<b>Learning outcomes – how did the trip/visit meet the curriculum objectives.</b>	National Curriculum KS2 History: ‘a study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils’ chronological knowledge beyond 1066’ Children were informed on this trip all about different aspects of WW2 and the impact this had on Britain.
<b>Did the children enjoy the trip? (Quotes of what they enjoyed children if appropriate)</b>	Yes: “I really enjoyed digging up the potatoes like the Land Army Girls would have had to do to feed everyone.” “I liked going into the really old-fashioned shop and looking at the old food and drink and what they could have each week as part of rationing.” “I liked the horses” “I liked training to be a Home Guard”
<b>Cost of the trip / cost paid by parents.</b>	£15.00 per child
<b>Worth the cost?</b>	Yes. The children had the opportunity to learn about different aspects of WW2 Britain in different sections so as to not overload them with information. The physical activities to coincide with the verbal teaching helped to concrete their learning (e.g. sitting in an Anderson Shelter whilst talking about the Blitz/air raids). As we had already covered many of the areas of WW2 in our classroom lessons, this trip helped to further their knowledge.
